


bles, Florida, Lodge No. 1676. These are their stories.


Tabitha's mother worked three jobs to save enough money to move her family to a small town with a better public school system and the promise of more opportuni-

"I desperately wished to be seen as more than an extraordinary product of my unfortunate circumstances," Tabitha says.

She missed living in a city where seemingly everyone was working to overcome a disadvantage and no one was





Tabitha plans to study Political Science at American University. In the future, she hopes to become a lawyer who speaks for disenfranchised families and marginalized groups.

Like millions of others who came before them, the Ramirez family immigrated to America to give their children more. They left Cuba and resettled in Florida to raise their son. Victor.

"My family came to this country to give me a chance they never had," Victor says.

And now, he's the top male Most Valuable Student.

"I believe I've made the most of that chance," Victor says.

Victor will pursue a doctorate in Experimental Physics at Princeton this fall.

For 2019-20, the Elks National Foundation allocated \$2.9 million to fund the Most Valuable Student scholarship program, which includes 500 four-year scholarships ranging from \$4,000 to \$50,000. 
Sean received a \$500 grant to the charity of his choice, and he's chosen the Purple Pig, California-Hawaii Elks Association's major project aimed at addressing the

Looking ahead, Sean is eager to continue providing service to his community and to the Order, "as an Elks scholar and an Elks member."






