You Can Be the Spark

Every pledge the Elks National Foundation makes is a promise. A promise to build stronger Elks communities led to the creation of the Community Investments Program. A promise to foster the next generation of leaders served as the foundation of the scholarships program.

Most recently, the ENF promised to help end veteran homelessness by pledging \$4 million in support of the Elks National Veterans Service Commission's Welcome Home initiative. This promise has helped the Elks change thousands of veterans' lives—veterans like Rose.

Rose is the mother of twin daughters, an entrepreneur, and a Marine Corps veteran. When she found herself behind on rent, unable to pay the bills and put food on the table, she turned to the Elks' Emergency Assistance Fund, and they answered the call.

Rose's rent. When asked what she would say to anyone considering donating in support of the Emergency Assistance Fund, Rose says, "I would say that you have a chance to be a catalyst in somebody's life. It's a butterfly effect. Why wouldn't you want to be that catalyst or that spark?"



Secretary's Corner

Membership Status: We ended the year with a count of 264 members. We lost 5 members to death and dropped 31 members for non-payment of dues.

The 31 members that were dropped have a grace period of 60 days to be reinstated. If you know a member that was dropped for non-payment of dues will you please reach out to them and encourage them to consider keeping their membership active they have until May 30th to become current with their dues. They must pay last year plus the current year to be re-instated.

When you pay your dues it includes assessments from the Grand Lodge and the CT State Elks organization. The money owed is based on our membership number as of April 1st, 2019 and must be paid to the Grand Lodge by the end of April whether the member is has paid their dues or not. We currently have 86 members who are delinquent in paying their dues for which the assessment for them is over \$1700. If you are delinquent please pay your dues! You can pay at the Lodge, send a check or via Paypal on DanburyElks.Org.

A reminder notice will be sent the beginning of May to those members who have not yet paid this years dues.

ENF Community Investment Program Grants -WE need your input!

Are you aware that there are 7 ENF grants that all Lodges may apply for starting April 1st?

The awards of the grants range from \$1500 to \$10,000 and each grant has a different criteria and focus. We are currently eligible to apply for the following grants.

- Lodge Assistance Grant. which allows Lodges to secure donations from foundations or corporations for specific Lodge charitable projects through restricted monetary donations to the ENF. Tax deduction for the Corporation.
- Gratitude Grant-This \$2,000 grant is available to lodges that meet their per member giving goal to the ENF. May be a donation, but more active projects are encouraged.
- Beacon Grant-This \$2000 grant is targeted to ongoing lodge led charitable programs..
- Promise Grant- \$2,500 grant available to the first 500 lodges that apply to hold eligible, charitable youth projects. Must be an activity, not a donation..
- Impact Grant- Grants range from \$2,500 to \$10,000 and are competitive grants designed for large-scale service projects.
